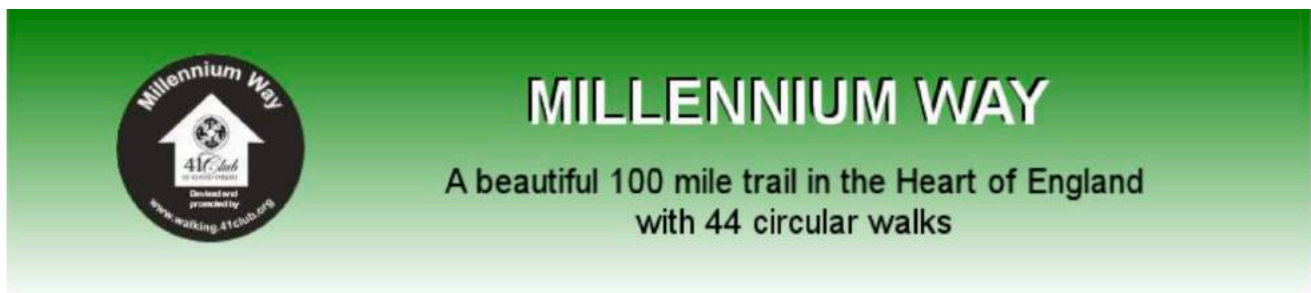

WORCESTERSHIRE MILLENNIUM WAY WALKING FESTIVAL

The Millennium Way team from 41 Club, in association with Worcestershire County Council, is organising its second 4 day Walking Festival in September 2019. It features 8 of our fabulous circular walks through the lovely Worcestershire countryside, one each morning and one each afternoon. You can see all the routes from our home page. They are between 3 and 8 miles in length. There is also a walk specially set up for the less able, which is known as the Easy Access Walk. This is for cross country wheelchairs and those with physical restrictions.

Booking in is easy and free, although we ask for a donation at the start of each route to cover some of our expenses. Just click "[here for the booking page](#)" and give a few details and you are booked. If you do not book and then turn up, you take the risk the walk will be full.

Starting times are below and on the booking form. We will depart promptly so **please arrive 15 minutes before your booked time**. There will be guides to help with advice and the route, but walkers need to come prepared with suitable clothing for the expected weather, decent footwear and some snacks and drink. We will take as much care as we can to point out any hazards, but we are walking in the countryside, which has fences, gates, bridges, barbed wire, stiles, uneven ground, farm animals etc to contend with. The terrain is mostly gently undulating. Children can be accommodated as long as they have a supervising adult and can keep up with adult walkers. Dogs are not permitted on festival guided walks, but are usually welcome on the Millennium Way, subject to observance of the Countryside Code. If you have an Assistance dog please contact us to discuss how we can help.

In order to run the event and communicate with you now and in the future, we hold your name, contact details and town of residence. These details will not be shared with anyone.

THE PROGRAM FOR 2019 will go east from Pershore, rather than west towards Pershore as we did last year. In addition we have started on Thursday and will finish on Sunday.
