The articles below are reproduced from the December Newsletter and the preceding Winter edition of the 41 Club Magazine These are followed by the personal account of GB&I YAPs in 2019 in India

(a glossier version of which will appear in the next magazine)



Last year GB&I joined the YAP program and, for the first time this year, 3 of our young people have been on tours to North India, South India and South Africa.

Next year we will continue to be involved and have the opportunity to send young people that are children of 41ers on tours/programs as well as receive young people from other countries to GB&I to experience life here.

REQUIREMENTS TO BE A YAP-PARTICIPANT

- You should be between 18 and 24 yrs old and a child/grandchild of a 41er.
- You will be asked to pay your flight ticket, your transfer and administrative fees.
- You should be capable of giving a presentation about your country in English and, in so doing, act as a young ambassador.

Before departure:

- Send all forms digitally to your National Convenor and to the International YAP Convenor. (Application, Guest letter including photo)
- · Send Proof of Medical and Liability Insurance.
- Pay the administration fee (in €)
- After your return, you are expected to deliver a report to your National Board and to your club's Media.

Tours are available to North India, South India, South Africa, Cyprus, Southern Europe and Northern Europe. All tours take place between late May and September.

Any young people wishing to apply should visit the YAP website https://yap-famex.org for more information and also to get a copy of the application form etc. These should be completed and returned to Andy Ventress IRO, international@41club.org and also Christoph Haenssler, Interna-tional YAP Convenor, chaenssler@bluewin.ch.

For the first time, in 2020, GB&I will be expected to host young people for a number of days. I am therefore looking for clubs that would be interested in hosting.

A club would be required to home host the young people for 2/3 days/nights. There will be approximately 12 youngsters in the group. They will need to be hosted in in 4 to 6 homes hopefully with a young person of a similar age.

DUTIES OF A YAP-HOSTING CLUB INCLUDE:

- Making sure all participants of the YAP-tour have a host family.
- Assumption of all costs for room and board and entrance-fees.
- (The costs of transfers from club to club are covered by the YAP tour fee)
- Ensuring that the YAP participants have the opportunity to learn more about your country, region or town.
- Informing your guests about the characteristics of your region by organising sightseeing tours, visits of busi-nesses and factories and by showing them RT/ 41er projects.
- Coordinating group transports with the hosting clubs in charge before and after you.

A Passage to India

Young Ambassador's Programme 2019

"India, India"; a phrase that followed me around as I toured the country for three weeks of my summer. As I discovered more of this diverse and hectic place, I grew to understand that there is perhaps no other way of describing India to a travelling foreigner. When the crazy traffic is forcing you to grip the seat with white knuckles, the driver has no other explanation than: "Ahh... India, India".

However, I will endeavour to better describe what an amazing experience I had on the Young Ambassador's Programme to Northern India this August. A once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, I heard about the YAPs 41 Club exchange programme from a friend of mine in Finland last year. Having just returned from India herself, she described to me a trip with a group of students, aged between eighteen and twenty-five, from various countries in Europe who had embarked upon an adventure to stay with host families from India's 41 Clubs, whose children in turn had travelled to Europe for the exchange. When questioning her further, she told me that not only do you have the option to go to India, but also to South Africa if you would prefer. I, however,

thought that India sounded like a fascinating change of culture and scenery, and I was keen to explore a country that I had never considered travelling to before.

As the first British student to ever join the trip to North India, when landing in Mumbai and meeting my travelling companions for the first time I was greeted with amazed faces asking me



"Oh my gosh, are you the girl from Britain?! I had no idea that you guys were even involved in the YAPs tours." When applying a few months previously, it was clear that the exchange programme was generally based around particular countries in mainland Europe, as these were the countries that the Indian and South African 41 Clubs sent their children in return. However, the programme convenors assured me that they would love to have someone come from Britain

to expand the network and shake up the group. So, when I arrived in Mumbai I was thrown into

an adventure with twelve strangers: two from Italy, two from the Netherlands, five from Germany, one from Switzerland, one from Belgium, one from Denmark, and me. I had spotted them from a mile off in the airport; the only scared, European faces in the whole place.

I can assure you that nothing forms a bond with a group of strangers like travelling to somewhere like Mumbai.



Everything on the YAPs

tour is planned down to the letter. The group is accompanied everywhere by members of the

41 Clubs and they are wonderful hosts. They made so much effort to welcome us into their homes.

So, there I was, walking cautiously and nervously towards the arrivals gate at Mumbai airport,

not really sure what was in store for me when I got there. I had no need to worry though, we were greeted on the outside by our hosts waving and holding banners saying "Welcome from England! Welcome from Italy! Welcome from Denmark!", and from there our adventure in India began.

Nothing I can tell you will prepare you for the utter carnage of Indian traffic and daily life once you leave the calm of the airport. I can only explain that the rules of the road are: there are no rules! Everyone drives and walks wherever they want to. There are dogs and cows running around in the middle of the road, and the drivers simply drive around them, blasting their horns at everyone and everything. I was squeezed in between the two girls from Italy in the back of the car. Despite having only just formed their acquaintance five minutes ago, we were gripping each other's hands and, rather amusingly, they were exclaiming "Oh Mamma Mia!" at the chaos happening

around us.

Most of India is like this; absolute crazy, hectic chaos, and people industriously getting on with their busy lives. But that is exactly what you learn to love about the place, and what makes it so very different from Europe.

We travelled to ten different cities on our trip: Mumbai, Pune, Nashik, Surat, Ahmedabad,



Jaisalmer, Jodhpur, Jaipur, Agra and Delhi. Every handover between cities was organised,

whether we travelled by car, train or plane, and we were never left alone to fend for ourselves.

In every city, they showed us the sights and walked us around the streets so we could get a feel for the place and immerse ourselves in the 'real India'. Visiting famous temples, museums and tourist attractions like Gandhi's house along the way, we meandered our way




through the streets of

each city. In my opinion, the people make the country, and being in the middle of the hustle and bustle of their normal lives and mundane routines is the only way to see India... and it was absolutely fascinating. Everything is colourful; the temples, the food in the markets, the spices and the clothes of the people walking around us. India does not experience heavy tourism, which makes it a very unique experience for us travelling from Europe. The local people watched us in complete awe as we walked past them on the streets. They were fascinated to see white Europeans in their city and I have lost count of the number of photographs I got stopped for. Women came up and asked me for selfies, or to hold their babies while they photographed me to show to their friends and family. This is a very endearing side of India, but it is something that you never quite get used to!

Furthermore, in every city we visited, the hosts arranged parties to welcome us and introduce us to some of their traditions and rituals. The parties were a real opportunity to talk to the members of the 41 Clubs and their families and make friends that you will remain in contact with even after you have left. Often they provided us with traditional dress and arranged for us to have henna drawn on our arms and hands. But mostly, these parties consisted of a lot of Indian music, alcohol and food. I promise you that you will not go hungry in India!

As well as touring the cities, our hosts arranged for us to do very exciting one-off activities that we all thoroughly enjoyed. In Pune, we travelled up into the mountains where we grappled through a waterfall and zip-lined through the trees, in Mumbai they took us to visit the world's biggest slum "Dharavi", and in Jaisalmer they arranged camel rides and jeep racing across the sand dunes.

However, the best thing about the YAPs tour is the group that you travel with. I could talk for hours about all the amazing moments, good memories and hilarious conversations we had



together. Travelling together for three weeks in India, you feel as if you have known each other for three years, and it is hard to let go at the end. I remember a very teary goodbye on our last evening. As cheesy as it sounds, you land in Mumbai with a bunch of strangers, and you leave Delhi with something closely resembling a family.

To conclude my story from India, I have four tips if you are planning on putting in an application for next year:

- 1.Take medication for when you get food poisoning. It is definitely a 'when', not an 'if'.
- 2.Do not wear white shoes into slums. They will end up in the rubbish bin.
- 3.Take a rain coat. Nothing can prepare you for India in monsoon season.
- 4.Take an umbrella for when your raincoat gets completely soaked through.

Last year saw another very successful fund raising and enjoyable festival of real ales and ciders.





In the afternoon we continue through the picturesque countryside and rural villages before returning to the hotel.


On the Sunday we will be doing a Dickens tour finishing in Rochester. We will travel on country lanes along the Saxon Shore Way visiting the area which was featured in many of Charles Dickens novel's including the graves at Cooling which was the setting for Great Expectations. Visiting a bird sanctuary, one of Europe's major migration sites, which over 300,000 birds use with panoramic views over the marshes and the River Thames.

We finish in the historical City of Rochester with its Castle and Cathedral which is the second oldest in England.

We have arranged with the hotel for an extra night for those who wish to visit other parts of Kent. The hotel is about 50 miles from Dover for the ferry or Folkestone for Eurotunnel. Also Ebbsfleet is about 15 minutes from the hotel where members can take a day trip via Eurostar which has trains to Paris, Brussels or Lillie.




