Hopefully these green shoots will continue to grow as there is hope for a further 2 new clubs setting up later in the year in region 2.



### Amigos españoles?



You may be aware of the 41 Club 'Buddies' service here in GB&I, but you may not be aware that Bob Oxley, one of our founder Buddies is based in Spain and since retiring there many years ago has used his experience in providing a Spanish Buddies-style support for English-speaking people there.

Bob says "I used to be in Sawbridgeworth and High Wycombe Round Tables and then I joined Wycombe 41 Club and Wycombe Old Tablers (WOTs).

"When I retired to Spain many years ago, I joined Costa Blanca 41 Club as well as the Samaritans in Spain. Seven years ago they closed down our Samaritans branch on the Costa Blanca north so the team I was in decided not to waste their training and started the first registered 24-hour English-speaking service similar to the 41 Cub Buddies, called 'The Listeners'".

Did it catch on straight away?

Bob says "Well we had a very slow start, but thanks to the support of one or two local council authorities, and some of the English language newspapers' supportive publicity, we realised that there was a need for our service, which was extended two years later with the first English speaking bereavement group known as 'Stepping Stones'".

He adds "There is no doubt that my Round Table community service experience certainly led to my joining the Samaritans in Spain when I retired from working."

"Whilst my location has meant that I haven't been able a regular on the Buddyline Rota, I've enjoyed being part of the Buddies and adding my experience to the discussions when it was being set up. I believe that the 41 Club Buddies team have done a fantastic job in the short time that Buddyline has been operating, and I am certain that it will continue to grow and provide a valuable service to ex-Tablers."

### Happy 1st Birthday Buddyline!

A year ago, the 41 Club Buddyline was started.

It was simple idea that was intended to provide 41 club members with a number to phone if they wanted to chat, and maybe help address any potential loneliness and isolation during and following last year's lockdown.

We had all hoped back then that a year on, we would all be out of lockdown, free from any Covid restrictions and enjoying what 41 Club does best – unfettered fun and fellowship as we look forward to our Christmas Club meetings.

Sadly things don't always go to plan and we're still being cautious about meeting up and getting out.

The Buddyline continues to be there for all members and is manned by volunteer 'Buddies' from 10am to 10pm, 7 days a week. The team of volunteers have done a great job working together and I thank every one of them for their ongoing support and commitment throughout the year.

Examples of the type of calls received include:

- Someone who was generally OK, had no serious issues, felt something was missing in his life but just didn't know what it was. The Buddy chatted to him about his background and interests, why the caller felt the way he did and suggested some external organisations to follow up with.
- Someone who had moved house, had lost the contact details of a close friend and befriender within the Association for six months and was desperate to try and reconnect with them. The Buddy found the contact details of the member and befriender on the CAS system, and after checking with the member was able to provide the contact number to the caller so that they could be reconnected. The caller was overjoyed at being given the contact number again.
- Someone who was felling very isolated and alone and suffering with Asperger's, had no family and friends and was desperate to engage with other people. The Buddy spoke for over an hour with the caller, found out what interest he had and made contact with the local 'Men in Sheds' Association and a local befriender organisation on the caller's behalf. This caller wasn't a 41 Club member but had been given the Buddyline number to call.

In these challenging times, it is important to remind all Clubs that ours is a fellowship association and that consequently we should all ensure we support our own members. So if one of your members hasn't attended Club meetings recently or hasn't been in touch – then maybe it would be helpful to reach out and make a call just to see if they are OK.

At the end of the day, we are all buddies to each other – and all Clubs are asked to ensure we are all living up to our Association's Grace of "being ever mindful of those less fortunate than ourselves" and to our Association Toast – To Continued Friendship".

Could you be a Buddy for fellow members? Your Association Needs you!



We are always looking for new members to join our Buddies Group. You will only be on call one day a week along with other Buddies – all you need to be is a good listener and enjoy a chat!



## National Walking Weekend 2022 SAVE THE DATE: 1st - 3rd July 2022 Oakwood Hall Hotel, Bingley Shipley 41 Club

Following the great success of this year's inaugural National Walking weekend held in Pembrokeshire that attracted more than 40 enthusiastic walkers. I am delighted to inform you that the 2022 National Walking weekend will be held in "God's own" Yorkshire. The event will take place on the weekend of the 1st to 3rd of July 2022.

Our base Hotel will be the historic Oakwood Hall Hotel in Bingley, where we have secured favourable rates for the weekend. If the demand is sufficient we will be able to use an overflow Hotel which is less than 200 yards from our base.

There are several walks available to us from a gentle 4 mile walk along the Leeds Liverpool canal, passing by famous Five Rise locks and proceeding to the village of Saltaire, a world heritage site, where walkers can spend some post walk time exploring the village and learning it's history along with enjoying some refreshments in the many establishments available.

For the slightly more enthusiastic, we have a gentle 8 mile walk along the canal from Apperley Bridge to Saltaire, via the village of Esholt, the village of Emmerdale in the TV series. We plan to meet up with the 4 mile walkers in Saltaire to enjoy lunch and/or other refreshments.

For the more ambitious walkers the afternoon walk will be a "yomp" over Baildon Moors to enjoy some fantastic scenery and to get your heart pumping, returning to the Hotel for Tea and scones in the late afternoon.

Similarly to the event in Pembrokeshire, for those arriving on Thursday evening, A trip to a local restaurant will be organised and on Friday we will have a 6 mile riverside loop walk from Grassington to Burnsall. Walkers may then spend time exploring Grassington or travel to the nearby town of Ilkley for a stroll around the shops. A short walk will be arranged on Sunday morning with a suitable venue to be found to enjoy lunch.

Accommodation can be arranged for those who wish to stay an extra night on the Sunday.

Booking details for the weekend will be on the 41Club booking site early in the new year.



Savour the rugged scenes of Seyðisfjörður, and experience scenic cruising by the coastal Hornstrandir cliffs, jagged rock faces that are home to the Elf King and Queen, the dragon tail-like peaks of Drangaskord and Borgarfjordur Eystri. Time spent sailing in Faroese will be unforgettable too; behold the sight of the imposing Vestmanna and Gasadalur cliffs, and of dramatic isles and sea stacks. Ashore, in Klaksvik and Tórshavn, you can learn of the Faroe's historic links to the Vikings.


